Resolution 1978-13-16

XEROX EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS

WHEREAS, it has been documented that Xerox Corporation has produced and distributed materials (printed and films) pertaining to firearms control with suggestive against hunting, and

WHEREAS, Xerox Corporation has made a special effort in putting these materials in state educational systems, and

WHEREAS, these educational efforts are in direct conflict with programs of all state wildlife agencies in the United States, and

WHEREAS, all state wildlife agencies promote and utilize scientific procedures in the management of game as well as nongame species, and

WHEREAS, in addition to furnishing many millions man days of outdoor recreation, hunting is a management tool for control of certain animal populations, and

WHEREAS, materials being distributed by Xerox Corporation can adversely affect the scientific management of the Nation's wildlife resources, and

WHEREAS, state wildlife agencies utilizing Xerox Corporation products make possible the dissemination of materials injurious to state wildlife conservation programs;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the International Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies, at its annual convention at Baltimore, September 13, 1978, expresses its deep concern over the frequent inaccuracies of the material it has reviewed, and because of the importance of the materials distributed by Xerox Corporation offers to establish a review committee to work with the Corporation to assist in developing the authenticity of the educational materials.
