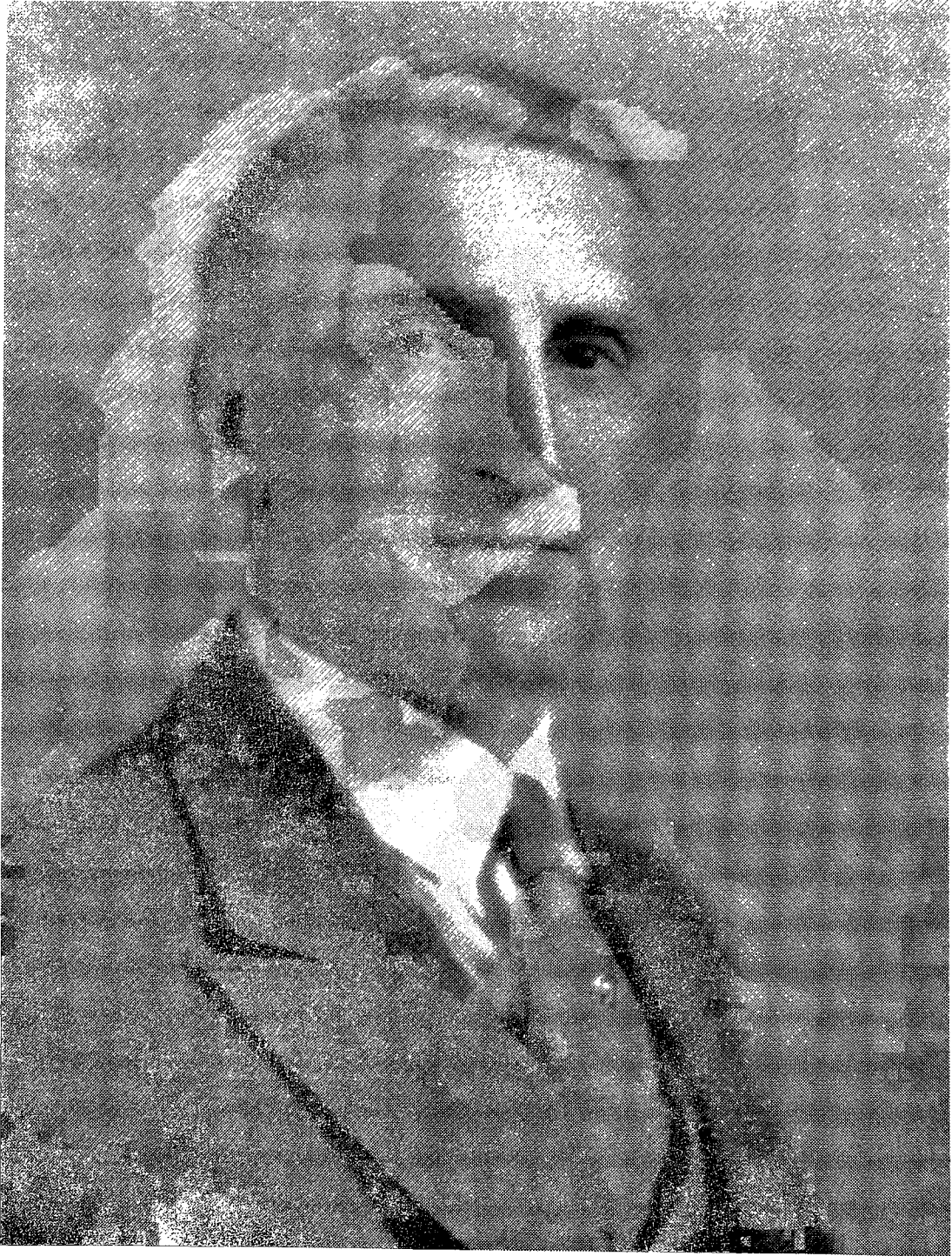

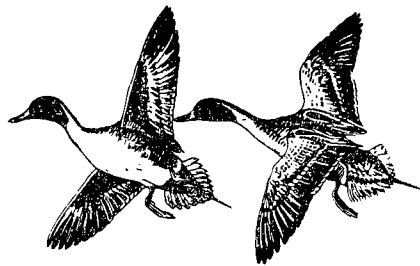

REPORT OF AUDITING COMMITTEE

Dr. H. H. Mackay: The members of the Auditing Committee have examined the books and the report of the Secretary-Treasurer of the International Association of Game, Fish and Conservation Commissioners, and find these to be correct and in proper order.

REPORT OF TIME AND PLACE COMMITTEE

(The following report was subsequently submitted by the joint committee on Time and Place of the International Association and the American Fisheries Society):

The joint committee on Time and Place met in the Royal York Hotel, and after due deliberation it was regularly moved and seconded that the 1941 meeting of the International Association of Game, Fish and Conservation Commissioners and the American Fisheries Society be held in the city of St. Louis, Missouri, during the week of August 25 to 29.

The motion was passed unanimously.

The President: We will now have the report of the Resolutions Committee.

REPORT OF RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

Mr. Shawhan: Mr. Chairman, your Committee, having completed its deliberations, is now ready to report. The first resolution is as follows:

COOPERATION OF MEXICO IN CONSERVATION

Whereas the International Association of Game, Fish and Conservation Commissioners, in session assembled at Toronto, Canada, this third day of September, 1940, has been advised that the republic of Mexico is not officially represented in this convention; and

Whereas Honorable Eduardo Hay, Secretary of Exterior Relations for Mexico, has transmitted a message expressing his country's active interest in the work of this Association and the proceedings of this convention: Now therefore be it

Resolved, That this Association hereby records its regrets that circumstances have not permitted the republic of Mexico to participate in this 34th Annual Convention and render its usual constructive contributions thereto; be it further

Resolved, That this Association hereby expresses its confidence that the valuable work heretofore performed and the service rendered in the past by the republic of Mexico in conservation of natural resources, and the cooperation given to the United States of America and the Dominion of Canada, all of which has been of great international benefit, will continue with unabated and undiminished vigor and diligence; be it finally

Resolved, That the Secretary be authorized and directed to transmit a copy of these resolutions to the Honorable Eduardo Hay.

Mr. LeCompte: I move adoption of the resolution.

Mr. Stephens: I second the motion.

(The resolution was agreed to.)
